Executive Summary

GOVERNOR: Addressing the large increase in numbers in Ohio, DeWine said some of this can be attributed to the increase in testing, however he added that the experts do not believe the increase in testing is the only explanation for the increase in cases.

In the counties in southwest Ohio, DeWine shows that the R-naught rate is now rising above 1.9 in Hamilton and Clermont counties. Ohio is aiming to keep that number at or below 1, and the higher it gets the more rapidly it shows the disease is spreading.

TESTING: ODH has begun disclosing more specific testing data on their Coronavirus dashboard. This data includes the COVID-19 diagnostic testing data, including total daily tests performed and cumulative percentage of positive tests. This data includes laboratory testing from hospitals, private labs and the ODH lab.

UNEMPLOYMENT: Ohioans filed 34,553 initial claims for unemployment compensation last week, up slightly from the previous week.

While about 1.4 million residents have filed new jobless claims over the last 14 weeks, Ohio saw 314,744 fewer continued claims last week compared to the state's peak in April, according to Department of Job and Family Services data.

Last week's total for new claims was up from 32,788 for the week ending June 13.

The Department of Labor reported 1.48 million new unemployment claims nationwide last week, down from a revised total of 1.54 million the previous week.
