Executive Summary

GOVERNOR: Governor DeWine announced that tomorrow, December 8th, Ohio will be aligning with the CDC's current case definition, which means that we will begin reflecting the backlogged antigen tests immediately in the daily reported case counts moving forward. This will result in a one-day spike in reported cases tomorrow. These cases will be assigned to their appropriate onset date.

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All of the backlogged tests will not translate into new cases, they will be checked and duplicated records will be removed. The test results will be added to the positivity calculation in the coming weeks.

PHASED APPROACH TO VACCINE ADMINISTRATION

Governor DeWine announced that Phase 1A of the vaccine will be available around December 15, 2020. Phase 1A of distribution priorities - in no particular order include:

Health care providers and personnel routinely involved with the care of COVID-19 patients

Residents and staff at nursing facilities

Residents and staff at assisted living facilities

Residents and staff of Ohio's veterans' homes

Patients and staff at psychiatric hospitals

People with intellectual disabilities and those who live with mental illness who live in group homes and their staff

EMS responders

The federal government has made it clear that we will not know for sure how many vaccines are coming until closer to the time the shipments are finalized.

Our current understanding, which is subject to change, is that we will receive a shipment from Pfizer on December 15th with 9,750 vaccines for hospitals (prepositioned sites) and 88,725 for Walgreens and CVS for congregate care settings.

On December 22, we anticipate a shipment of 201,000 vaccines from Moderna. These will go to 98 hospitals and 108 health departments. Hospitals will vaccinate those dealing with COVID-19 patients. Health departments will vaccinate people like EMS, home health care works, and others.

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TESTING LOCATIONS: ALERT! Drive Up COVID19 Testing Available in Sandusky County on Wednesday, December 9th from 10am to 2pm at Rodger Young Park, 711 South Front St. Fremont Ohio 43420. This is a NO COST, NO APPOINTMENT, NO SYMPTOMS NECESSARY for testing. Seneca County is currently in the process of scheduling the same type of pop up testing.

DeWine has started a walk-up/drive-up testing initiative with the Ohio Association of Community Health Centers and their affiliate members and the Ohio National Guard. These sites will also include other local community-based organizations i.e., faith-based organizations, community centers, food pantries, etc.

Testing for this initiative will be available for individuals with or without symptoms. The test has no out-of-pocket cost to the patient and individuals of any age are able to access the test. Minors will need signed consent of a parent/guardian.

Travel Advisory: Those entering Ohio after traveling to states reporting positive testing rates of 15% or higher for COVID-19 are advised to self-quarantine for 14 days.

The list of states will be updated every week on Wednesday. Based on a 7-day rolling average of positivity rates of November 18, the affected states are highlighted in yellow on the attached map.

What do you do if you have symptoms of COVID? Contact your doctor. If you don't have a doctor, but have insurance, check to see if your insurance has tele-health and see a doctor. If your doctor does not recommend a COVID test but you need one, call the Tiffin Community Health Center, 419.455.8140 and make an appointment.

PCR swab tests may take 4-6 days to return results as they must be sent to a lab and be cultured to test for the virus. Rapid tests have a much shorter return time, but are in short supply. No test is 100% accurate. The test relies on, among other things, the amount of virus in your system at the time of the test. Tests are available at the following locations:

The Public Health Advisory System shows that Seneca County has met 5 of the 7 indicators needed to change the level. Key points:

Regionally, there are 725 COVID-19 patients with 422 (58%) in Lucas County hospitals, 93 (13%) in Allen County hospitals, and the remaining 210 (29%) from other NW Ohio counties

Regionally, there are 184 COVID Critical Care patients with 125 (68%) in Lucas County hospitals, 11 (6%) in Allen County hospitals, and the remaining 48 (26%) from other NW Ohio counties

Out of 38 regional hospitals reporting, 18 hospitals reported strained or critical nursing shortages (47%)

· The number of COVID-19 hospitalized patients in Region 1 and Regions 1, 2 and 5 (Zone 1) combined continues to increase

o Region 1 COVID-19 hospitalized patients are higher than our previous peak in the 200-330 range in mid-April

o Zone 1 COVID-19 hospitalized patients are higher than our previous peak in the 690-700 range in mid-April

· Cases reported through the Ohio Department of Health continue to increase substantially each day

· The statewide median age for COVID-19 is 42 years old

· The statewide 7-day average positivity rate for testing is 15.9%
