Executive Summary

Ohio Legislation

A House panel today voted along party lines to restrict the state health director's ability to issue orders that limit business operations and the movement of Ohioans.

The chamber's State & Local Government Committee approved an amendment to legislation on occupational licensing (SB 1) that would limit any order issued by the state health director to 14 days unless an extension is approved by the legislative Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review with three



affirmative votes from both House and Senate JCARR members under the bill. If JCARR doesn't act, the health order would be rescinded.

The amendment would apply to any order issued on or after April 29, 2020 and also gives any Ohio citizen standing to seek a court order requiring the Director to comply with the requirement.

The amendment comes amid growing criticism by some majority Republicans of the DeWine Administration's orders regarding business closures and personal limitations as part of efforts to slow the spread of coronavirus.

The bill is scheduled for a House floor vote later Wednesday. If and when approved by the House, the bill will go to the Senate for a concurrence vote. The Senate is scheduled to be in session today, but a time has not been announced.

Seneca County

The Seneca County Board of Commissioners met digitally via Zoom Thursday morning. One topic of discussion was how office operations may change as parts of the state begin to re-open. Commissioner Shayne Thomas said many offices including the commissioners' office, will continue to be closed on Fridays for budgetary reasons until finances recover. Seneca County General Health District:

The Health Commissioner clarified the Seneca County Coronavirus numbers as 14 total confirmed cases of the COVID19 virus which INCLUDES 7 currently ill (one of those currently hospitalized), 8 recovered from the illness and 1 deceased due to complications of COVID19.

Emergency Management Agency

As buildings re-open under the "Responsible RestartOhio" plan that have had little to no water usage during the Stay at Home Order due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it is important to flush water that has been stagnant in both cold- and hot-water distribution lines and fixtures. Low water usage can contribute to bacterial growth, including Legionella which can cause a serious type of pneumonia called Legionnaires' disease. It can also cause other water quality issues with potential health risks due to the build-up of lead and copper in stagnant water that's been collecting in older pipes and fixtures.

As buildings reopen, it is critical to drain, flush, and if necessary based on a review of building conditions, disinfect the hot and cold-water systems to remove harmful contaminants. Devices that store water, such as drinking water fountains, water heaters, storage tanks, and any droplet or mist-forming devices such as cooling towers, humidifiers, showerheads, and certain medical and manufacturing devices and process equipment should also be flushed and disinfected in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations or industry best practices.



Blood Collection

The American Red Cross now faces a severe blood shortage due to an unprecedented number of blood drive cancellations in response to the coronavirus outbreak. **Blood donation is considered an essential service** to ensure the health of the community and is listed as an exception in the state order. While everyone is being asked to avoid mass gatherings, it's very important to note that blood drives are **not** considered "mass gatherings."
