Executive Summary

GOVERNOR: DeWine today announced that 6 new counties have been elevated to Level 3 in Ohio's Public Health Advisory System – Clermont, Fairfield, Lorain, Pickaway, Summit and Wood. Additionally, Huron County has been lowered from Level 3 to Level 2, leaving 12 total counties at Level 3.

Hamilton, Butler and Cuyahoga counties have all been put on the starred "watchlist" for increasing to Level 4. This means that these counties had enough indicators to classify as Level 4, also known as the purple level, this week, however the state waits until the county maintains that level for two weeks in a row before officially elevating it.

Franklin County on the other hand was removed from the watchlist as the county this week only met 5 indicators, down from the 6 indicators last week.

UNEMPLOYMENT: Ohioans filed 33,483 initial claims for unemployment compensation last week, according to the latest data from the Department of Job and Family Services.

The total represented a drop from the previous week, when 35,623 applications were received.

ODJFS reported continuing jobless claims fell for the 10th straight week, with Ohioans filing 347,587 fewer than at the state's peak in April.

The department said it has sent \$4.9 billion in unemployment compensation payments to more than 736,000 Ohioans over the last 16 weeks. About 6% of the jobless claims filed with the state over that time remain unprocessed.

The U.S. Department of Labor reported about 1.31 million initial claims for unemployment compensation were filed nationwide last week, down from a revised total of about 1.41 million the previous week.

Ohio State Fair:

The Expo Commission has cancelled the 2020 Ohio State Fair due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Ohio State Fair's management team along with the Ohio Expo Commission evaluated information from state and local health officials, along with the financial feasibility of a reduced attendance over the past several weeks.

The Health Department reports 37 total confirmed cases of the COVID-19 virus including 30 people who have recovered from the illness and two who have died due to complications of COVID19.

Last week the ODH reported erroneously that Seneca County was considered a LEVEL 2 county out of 4 statewide advisory levels. This data has since been checked and Seneca County's level was adjusted to a LEVEL 1.
