## **Executive Summary**

**7/23/20** GOVERNOR: During today's press conference, DeWine unveiled the latest Public Health Advisory System map, which added 8 new counties to the red level. Allen County is now stared as a county that is approaching purple, while Athens was removed from that watchlist.

**7/22/20** GOVERNOR: Gov. Mike DeWine on Wednesday announced residents statewide will generally be required to wear facial coverings in public starting at 6 p.m. Thursday.

The governor said a growing body of evidence suggests masks are a keyway to prevent COVID-19 from spreading.

"The jury's back. The verdict's in. Masks work," he said.

More than one-fifth of the state's counties and about 60% of the state's population already were under a mask mandate by the end of last week.



Governor DeWine announced today a travel advisory for all individuals coming into Ohio from states reporting positive COVID-19 testing rates of 15 percent or higher. Those traveling from one of the following states should self-quarantine for 14 days at home or in a

Those traveling from one of the following states should self-quarantine for 14 days at home or in a hotel.

Alabama Arizona Florida Georgia Idaho Mississippi Nevada South Carolina Texas

The self-quarantine recommendation applies to those who live in Ohio and to people who are traveling into Ohio from any of these states.

"I know this will be hard and is a sacrifice, especially as summer vacations are in full force, but when we have a higher likelihood of being exposed, we should take precautions to limit the exposure of others," said Governor DeWine.

During his press conference, DeWine also detailed several examples of house parties or other events leading to an outbreak of COVID-19 in the community. He was joined by a Clark County woman who held a 4th of July party that is connected to a number of infected people who attended. She warns that COVID-19 is real and that Ohioans need to heed the policies that are in place to reduce the spread.

## **Ohio State Fair:**

The Expo Commission has cancelled the 2020 Ohio State Fair due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Ohio State Fair's management team along with the Ohio Expo Commission evaluated information from state and local health officials, along with the financial feasibility of a reduced attendance over the past several weeks.

UNEMPLOYMENT: Ohioans filed 30,138 initial claims for unemployment compensation last week, according to the latest data from the Department of Job and Family Services.

The total represented a drop of more than 5,000 from the previous week, when residents filed 35,422 new applications.

ODJFS reported workers filed 423,672 continued jobless claims last week, down 352,630 compared with the state's peak earlier this year.

The department said it has sent more than \$5.5 billion in unemployment compensation payments to more than 757,000 Ohioans over the last 18 weeks.

The U.S. Department of Labor reported 1.4 million initial jobless claims were filed nationwide last week, up from 1.3 million for the previous week.
