Executive Summary

8/6/20 GOVERNOR: Gov. Mike DeWine announced Thursday he tested positive for COVID-19 as he underwent a standard screening practice prior to meeting with President Donald Trump later in the day. The governor has no symptoms at this time, his office said.

Mr. DeWine had planned to greet the president at Burke Lakefront Airport in Cleveland, but after his positive test, was returning to Columbus where he will be tested again.

As a result of the test, the governor will be quarantining in his Cedarville home for 14 days. Lt. Gov. Jon Husted also took the screening test and tested negative.

PUBLIC HEALTH ADVISORY SYSTEM: The Public Health Advisory Map has been updated to show 11 counties that are at the red level. Mercer County has been elevated to red, while Hamilton, Henry

and Lawrence counties have gone from red to orange. Several counties in the Appalachian region of the state have be decreased from orange to yellow.

The Health Department reports 186 total confirmed cases of the COVID-19 virus since March with a current count of 85 active cases. 98 people have recovered from the illness and 3 have died due to complications of COVID19.

UNEMPLOYMENT: Ohioans filed 25,952 initial claims for unemployment compensation last week, according to the Department of Job and Family Services. The total represents a drop from about 2,000 from the prior week, when the state received 27,937 new applications.

Ohioans filed 404,434 continued jobless claims last week – 371,868 fewer than the state's peak earlier this year – according to the latest data from ODJFS. ODJFS reported it has sent more than \$5.8 billion in unemployment compensation payments to more than 771,000 Ohioans over the last 20 weeks.

The U.S. Department of Labor reported about 1.19 million new jobless claims were filed nationwide last week, down from about 1.44 million the previous week.
