Executive Summary

GOVERNOR: Governor DeWine discussed the percentage of cases by age group and month, and we continue to see an increase in the 0-29 age group relative to the overall population. DeWine also stated that with the hospitalization rates by age group, those younger than 30 generally have a lower rate than those 30+.

Governor DeWine reviewed the top 10 Ohio counties ranked by the highest occurrence, which includes the following counties: Putnam; Butler; Mercer; Shelby; Montgomery; Auglaize; Franklin; Henry; Meigs; and Darke.

OHIO DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH: Governor DeWine announced today that Dr. Joan Duwve has been selected as the new director of the Ohio Department of Health. Dr. Duwve is currently the director of public health for the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control.

"I am thrilled to return to Ohio, where I grew up," said Dr. Duwve. "Through forging strong partnerships across the state, I firmly believe that together, we can build healthier communities that in turn create greater opportunities for all Ohioans to thrive."

A graduate of North Olmsted High School, Dr. Duwve attended undergraduate school at The Ohio State University. She received a Master of Public Health from the University of Michigan and her Medical Doctor Degree from Johns Hopkins University.

She is expected to start the new position October 1.

UNEMPLOYMENT: Ohioans filed 17,983 initial applications for unemployment compensation last week, according to ODJFS. The total represents a 4% decline from the previous week, when residents filed 18,719 new jobless claims.

ODJFS reported Ohioans filed 328,515 continued claims last week, down 447,787 compared with the state's peak earlier this year. The agency said it has distributed more than \$6.3 billion in unemployment compensation payments to more than 779,000 Ohioans over the last 25 weeks.

The U.S. Department of Labor reported 884,000 initial jobless claims were filed nationwide last week, even with the prior week. **Education:** http://www.ncoesc.org/
