## **Executive Summary**

**GOVERNOR:** Today, there are 7,790 new cases in Ohio. This is below average for the past 3 weeks, but is still at the elevated level we have seen since mid-November.

The Ohio Department of Health has released two new <u>maps</u> today. The first is a Cases per Capita Over Time. This map is designed to show you how your county compares to other counties. The second new map is an ICU Admissions Over Time map. This map shows each Hospital Preparedness Region and what percentage of the ICU patient population are COVID-19 patients. At the start of August, around 1 in 8 ICU patients statewide had COVID-19. Now, it is approximately 1 in 3 patients.

These two maps will be updated each week on Thursday.

**VACCINE:** We are currently in Phase 1-A of the vaccination process; however, Governor DeWine gave an update on the next category of people eligible for the vaccine.

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Governor DeWine went over the deaths from COVID-19 by age group. Those who are 65 and older represent 87% of the COVID-19 deaths. The group of Ohioans who are 65 and older will be in the next group of vaccinations. More information, including logistics, will be released in time.

The COVID-19 vaccine will also be offered to younger people with severe inherited or developmental disorders that make them particularly vulnerable – such as Sickle Cell or Down Syndrome.

The vaccine will be offered to all schools who want to go back or remain in person. All of the adults in the building who come in contact with children will be eligible for the COVID-19 vaccination.

The goal of the second phase will be around mid-January 2021.

**COVID-19 VACCINATION DASHBOARD:** The COVID-19 Vaccination Dashboard is now live, and displays the most recent data reported to the Ohio Department of Health regarding the number of individuals that have started and completed the COVID-19 vaccination series by various demographics and county of residence. This dashboard is available on the coronavirus.ohio.gov website, and will be updated daily.

#### PHASED APPROACH TO VACCINE ADMINISTRATION

Governor DeWine announced that Phase 1A of the vaccine will be available around December 15, 2020. Phase 1A of distribution priorities - in no particular order include:

Health care providers and personnel routinely involved with the care of COVID-19 patients

Residents and staff at nursing facilities

Residents and staff at assisted living facilities

Residents and staff of Ohio's veterans' homes

Patients and staff at psychiatric hospitals

People with intellectual disabilities and those who live with mental illness who live in group homes and their staff

**EMS** responders

# **TESTING LOCATIONS:** Seneca County is currently in the process of scheduling pop up testing. Date is tentatively scheduled with the National Guard in January.

DeWine has started a walk-up/drive-up testing initiative with the Ohio Association of Community Health Centers and their affiliate members and the Ohio National Guard. These sites will also include other local community-based organizations i.e., faith-based organizations, community centers, food pantries, etc.

Testing for this initiative will be available for individuals with or without symptoms. The test has no outof-pocket cost to the patient and individuals of any age are able to access the test. Minors will need signed consent of a parent/guardian.

What do you do if you have symptoms of COVID? Contact your doctor. If you don't have a doctor, but have insurance, check to see if your insurance has tele-health and see a doctor. If your doctor does not recommend a COVID test but you need one, call the Tiffin Community Health Center, 419.455.8140 and make an appointment.

PCR swab tests may take 4-6 days to return results as they must be sent to a lab and be cultured to test for the virus. Rapid tests have a must shorter return time, but are in short supply. No test is 100% accurate. The test relies on, among other things, the amount of virus in your sytem at the time of the test. Tests are available at the following locations:

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# Key points:

- Regionally, there are 648 COVID-19 patients with 365 (56%) in Lucas County hospitals, 90 (14%) in Allen County hospitals, and the remaining 193 (30%) from other NW Ohio counties
- <u>Regionally, there are 169 COVID-19 Critical Care patients with 117 (69%) in Lucas County</u> <u>hospitals, 17 (10%) in Allen County hospitals, and the remaining 35 (21%) from other NW Ohio</u> <u>counties</u>
- Out of 38 regional hospitals reporting, 20 hospitals reported strained or critical nursing shortages (53%)
- The statewide median age for COVID-19 is 43 years old
- The statewide 7-day average positivity rate for testing is 13.6%
